

We Are Conserving Water



The State of California is Under Emergency Water Conservation Regulations

The State Water Resources Control Board has adopted two emergency regulations which requires Californians to conserve up to 20% of water in response to ongoing drought. As a result of these emergency regulations, the District is now in Stage 2 of its Water Conservation Ordinance 2021-02.

District website at pphcsd.org. This Ordinance and Resolution establish six water supply stages each with specific water restrictions. Below are restrictions outlined in the first three stages. Stage 1 - Water Shortage

- No watering between 9 am to 6 pm during the months of June through October; no watering between 3 pm to 9 am during the months of November through May
- No runoff permitted
- No hosing driveways, sidewalks, parking lots, etc.
- All leaks must be repaired
- No washing cars without a shutoff nozzle
- No use of non-circulating fountains permitted
- All pools and hot tubs 600 gallons and more must have a cover
- Water used for cooling systems must be recycled to the extent possible.
- No watering outdoor landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall

Stage 2 - Moderate Water Shortage

- All conditions listed in Stage 1 apply
- All persons engaged in agricultural practices must provide, maintain, and use efficient equipment and watering practices
- No excessive outdoor watering exceeding the amount to provide reasonable irrigation
- All pools, of all sizes, shall use evaporation resistant covers and recirculate water.
- Customers who do not meet their conservation goals may be reviewed, restricted, penalized, and enforced by the District.

Stage 3 - Significant Water Shortage

- All conditions listed in Stage 2 apply
- Watering outdoor vegetation more than twice per week is prohibited. Properties with even numbered physical addresses shall water on Tuesdays and Saturdays of each week; properties with odd numbered physical addresses shall water on Wednesdays and Sundays of each week.
- The District will enhance its water waste monitoring programs to help ensure compliance
- Temporary user meter rentals will be suspended
